



## Student Components

### Introduction

Reading Street for California offers high-quality, authentic literature built around grade-level content like science and social studies unit concepts. There are opportunities for reading multiple genres such as realistic fiction and expository texts.

### Student Editions



The student editions for Grades 1–6 include the Big Question, Picture it! literacy posters, main text selections, paired selections, and activities for vocabulary, grammar, and comprehension such as *Think, Talk, and Write*. Students use the student editions as a resource and refer to the Picture it! posters to grasp literary ideas. They use the main text and paired selections to practice their target reading skills. Also, students complete activities that follow the texts to develop word knowledge and comprehension skills.

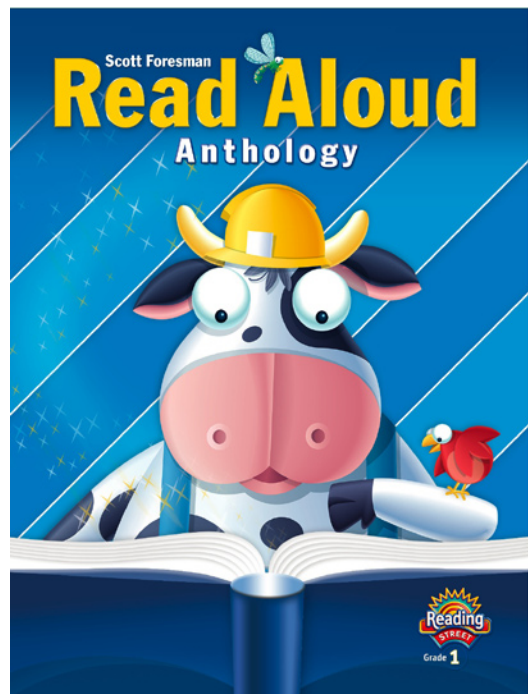
### Other Readers

Jon Scieszka’s award-winning Trucktown series on Reading Street is written for kindergarten students. The readers apply phonics skills and vocabulary taught during core lessons. There are thirty-six readers available in English and Spanish.

Decodable Books are available for Grades K–3. Teachers can use these books to practice decoding, phonics skills, and high-frequency word retention.

The Big Books package is available for Grades K–2. These books introduce concepts, provide shared reading opportunities, build vocabulary through amazing words, teach print concepts, and demonstrate fluent reading.

Content Readers are available for Grades 1–5. These offer extra support, more practice, and advanced selections. The concept or theme of each week’s main selection is incorporated into the text. Content Readers provide students with more



reading comprehension practice and high-frequency word knowledge. They are available in packages of six, bookshelf collections, and grade-level packages. EL Readers include accessible nonfiction and fiction text. Also, independent readers provide additional practice for kindergarten students.

The Read Aloud Anthology has selections for a variety of genres that help build vocabulary and develop concepts throughout the year. It is available for Grades K–3. All of these readers are identified in the teacher’s guides so teachers will know when to access them during the course of instruction.

## **Practice Books**

There are practice and review books for all grade levels. The Grades K–5 books provide phonics, vocabulary, and comprehension skills practice. There are also take-home newsletters called *Family Themes*. Grade 6 has daily standard review, test practice, and writing support. Teachers can use the practice and review books as blackline masters or a consumable workbook. These are used during lessons and as homework. The teacher’s guide explains when and how to use them.

The Grammar and Writing practice books provide four practice pages per week to reinforce grammar and writing instruction. There are cumulative skill reviews to reinforce concepts. These are used in Grades 1–6.

The Phonics/Word Study and Spelling practice books allow students to practice spelling with four practice pages per week and take-home word lists. The focus is on phonics in Grades 1–3 and on word study in Grades 4–6.

## **Review**

Reading Street for California has several resources to teach reading effectively. The student editions provide easy access to the class selections while content readers make great additions to the classroom library. The practice books help reinforce concepts through independent practice. These quality, authentic materials are built around grade-level concepts so the text and practice is connected to the lessons and ability level of the students.
