



My Teacher Resources provides links to the online Teacher's and Student editions, a variety of instructional resources, and information about Prentice Hall Online EssayScorer.

The Resources & Downloads section includes a Download Center with video, editable PowerPoint presentations, tests, and audio. The customizable PowerPoint presentations support instruction of reading and literary analysis skills.

The Teacher Resources section includes Unit Resources answer keys, professional development articles, and more.

The Spanish Resources section includes selection summary audio and translated versions of the videos. It also includes the Reader's Notebook Spanish Version and an English/Spanish Glossary.

The center of the page displays teachers' classes, along with a quick snapshot of the assessment results for each class.

The Additional Resources section provides the Product Support phone number and a link to myPearsonTraining.com, which provides Web-based training for the Prentice Hall Literature program, SuccessNet, and other Pearson products. This section also provides links to the infoplease.com Research Center and the Prentice Hall Web site.

The Messages section displays important SuccessNet notifications.

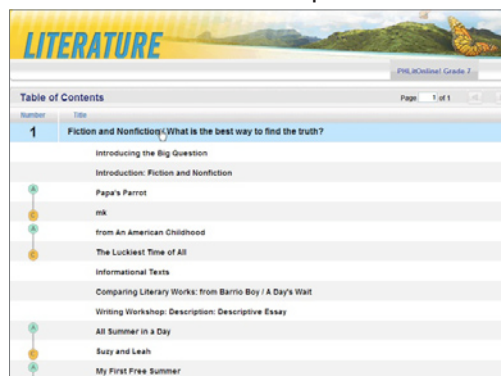
## Content Tab

The Content tab contains several options, such as the Table of Contents, tests, and a search function.

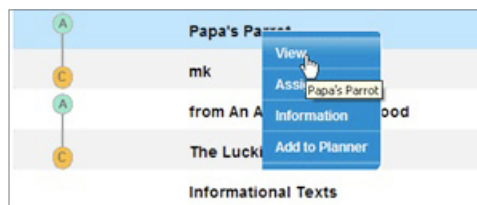

## Table of Contents

On the Table of Contents, click any unit to display the lessons. Then click any lesson title to access further options.



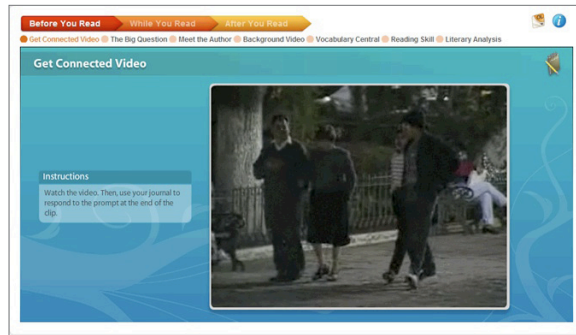
From the blue menu, choose the View option to preview or display the lesson for whole-class instruction. Teachers can also assign the lesson to students so it appears on their To Do list.



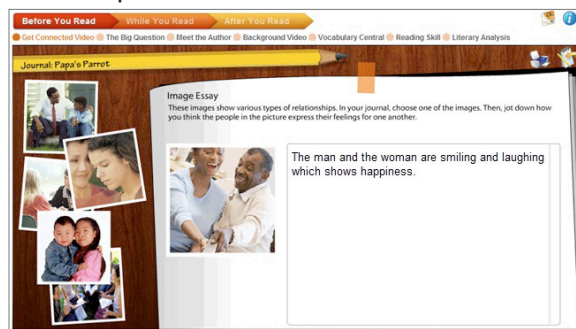
Information displays keywords and standards, and teachers can quickly add the lesson to their planners.

## Teaching with Technology

Teachers can use the interactive lesson content to enrich their instruction. They can show the Get Connected video and ask students to brainstorm responses to the writing prompt.



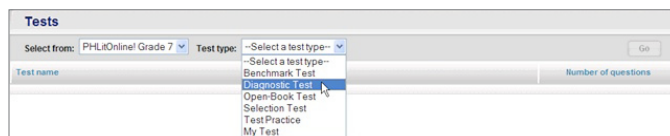
Teachers can also ask them to discuss each response and type a summary into the interactive journal. Then they can ask students to complete a written response for homework.



Students can also read or listen to the narration of selections online. Notice that teachers can view the on level, below level, or English Learner versions. Click key vocabulary words to access definitions with audio support. Type student responses to the side-column notes, and complete the graphic organizer to discuss the reading strategy. Students can also read and answer prompts independently.

## Tests

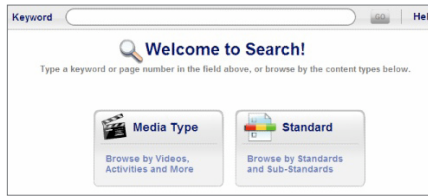
From the Content tab, teachers can select the Tests option. They can assign tests for students to complete online.



To view an example, select the Diagnostic Tests that include all of the Vocabulary in Context tests. Results from the diagnostic tests help teachers choose which leveled selection to assign and know which student needs additional reading support.

## Search

With Search, teachers can find lesson activities by keyword, media types, and standard.



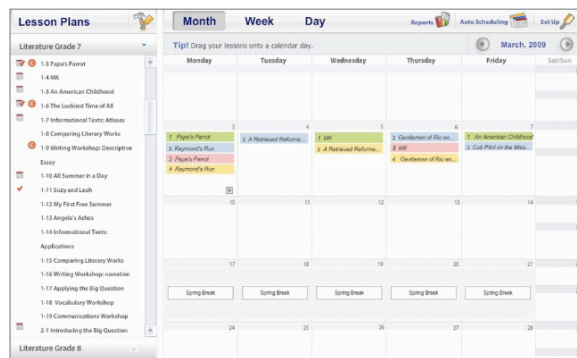
They can view, assign, or add activities to their planners. Teachers can also save their Favorites in folders for quick access.

## Planning Tab

The Planning tab includes a Lesson Planner, an Assignments section, a Preference Navigator, and a My Tests section.

### Lesson Planner

Lesson Planner enables teachers to plan and customize their lessons for every class. They can view, assign, and edit the lesson activities or lesson plan. The C icon identifies customized lessons in the Lesson Plan list.



## Assignments

The Assignments page lists all activities, lessons, and tests assigned to each class. Letters in the left column indicate the assignment type: A for activity, L for lesson, T for test, and R for remediation. The M indicates that the test requires manual scoring.

To view, comment, or score a student assignment, click the title and choose Edit/Score from the blue menu. Then click View Student Work to review and type comments. Mark the assignment as complete or rework needed. To score a test, click Score/Rescore.

## Classes Tab

The Classes tab includes options for managing classes and modifying Learner Settings.

The three Learner Setting levels—on level, below level, or English Learner—determine which text version of each selection and warm-ups appear for students when teachers assign lessons. Teachers should check this box if they opt for automatic adjustment of learner settings based on results of diagnostic tests. Manually assign students the English Learner level and do not enable automatic adjustment based on test results.

The below level and English Learner’s text versions online are the same as those found in the Reader’s Notebooks.

## **Reports Tab**

The Reports tab includes Lesson Progress, and the Test Scores, Mastery, and Item Analysis reports.

Lesson Progress shows the status of all lesson assignments by class. Click a student’s name to view their progress report. Click the title of any assignment to display more detail.

The Test Scores Report displays scores of every assigned test with both student and class averages. The Graph button instantly creates a bar graph of the data. Click a student’s name to display a detailed progress report that includes remediation activities assigned based on their test results.

The Mastery Report displays student mastery of reading and literary analysis skills. With this data teachers can track progress throughout the school year. Notice that they can export and save data from any report.

The Item Analysis Report provides data for individual tests. Incorrect answers are displayed in red. This report helps teachers quickly identify test items missed by a majority of students. With this information, they can make instructional decisions about reteaching specific skills.

## **Review**

This guide examined the Teacher Center, which is accessed from PHLitOnline.com. The Teacher Center provides access to everything teachers need to deliver instruction, access teaching resources, and monitor student progress.

The guide described the Content tab, which provides access to the Prentice Hall Literature Table of Contents, Tests, and Search. It explained how teachers could use the interactive lesson content for whole-class instruction or assign lessons to students for independent study.

It also described how teachers could access their planners and assignments lists from the Planning tab. On the Classes tab, teachers could manage their classes and modify Learner Settings. Finally, this guide explained how teachers have access to lesson progress and test reports from the Reports tab.
