

## Teachers: Adaptive Study Plans

### Introduction

This guide explains adaptive study plans on SuccessNet Plus. Pearson products that offer adaptive study plans help you personalize learning and deliver assessment-based instruction.

A personalized study plan is created for each student based on assessment results. The goal of the study plan is to fill in knowledge gaps and help each student master foundational concepts and skills.

### Example: *digits*

This is an example from *digits*, a middle school math program. Every *digits* unit begins with a readiness assessment. When students begins the assessment, an alert indicates that they must complete the assessment in one attempt.



### View Study Plans

To view a study plan, navigate to an activity or assessment that creates a study plan, and then select **Preview** from the Options menu. Underneath each skill, there is a list of study plan activities. When students do not meet the passing criteria for a skill, these activities are added to their study plans. Each activity or assessment includes a different number of questions that address specific skills or concepts.

### Modify Passing Threshold

To modify the passing threshold for study plans, enter a class and go to the study plan section on the Preferences tab. **NOTE:** This is a global preference and affects all study plans for the class.

## Assigning Assessments

When assigning an assessment that includes a study plan, the due date should be the date when all assigned study plan activities must be completed. Be sure to preview the number of study plan activities to determine an appropriate due date.

## View Activities

To view the study plan activities in the class gradebook, click **Student Performance** on the class banner from the home page. Look for the activity with a study plan in the content area on the left side of the page.

## Student Access

Click **Student View** to see how students access study plan activities. Locate an activity with a study plan on the To Do list. After the students complete the assessments, the scores appears on the left and the study plans appears on the right. To begin a study plan activity, students click the title or select **Open** from the Options menu. There may be several pages for each part of a lesson. When the students complete the activity, they click **Submit for Grading**.
